Dear Sir/Madam,

I hope this letter finds you well.

I am writing in my capacity [REDACTED] Union Council No. 8, Gulshan Town, Karachi, to formally register serious complaints and concerns regarding the ongoing construction activities of the Karachi Red Line BRT Project No. 47279-002 – Lot 2 (Co-Funded with ADB, AFD, and AIIB).

The areas falling under my jurisdiction and directly affected by the project include University Road Blocks 8, 9, 10, 15, and 16. Unfortunately, due to the ongoing construction activities and lack of proper coordination with local stakeholders, thousands of residents, students, patients, commuters, and business owners are facing severe difficulties on a daily basis.

We respectfully request your urgent intervention on an immediate basis regarding the following critical issues:

1. Failure of Existing Storm Water Drainage System

The existing storm water drainage infrastructure has become highly inadequate and frequently overflows during rainfall and even under normal circumstances. The current drainage system requires complete reconstruction and widening to effectively manage storm water flow and prevent urban flooding in densely populated areas.

2. Severely Damaged Sewerage System

The sewerage network from Saleem Plaza to PIA Planetarium has been almost completely damaged during the ongoing construction work. Due to severe blockages and collapse of sewerage lines, sewage water is now flowing directly into storm water drains, creating serious environmental, sanitation, and public health concerns. We strongly demand the immediate replacement and reconstruction of the entire damaged sewerage system.

3. Complete Blackout Along University Road

Large portions of University Road are facing complete blackout conditions due to non-functional or removed streetlights during the project execution. This situation has significantly increased safety and security risks for residents, pedestrians, students, women, patients, and commuters, especially during nighttime hours.

4. Impact on Educational, Religious, and Healthcare Institutions

The ongoing situation is badly affecting:

Approximately 40 schools,
20 mosques,
3 major hospitals, and
2 major universities
located within our constituency.

Students, patients, worshippers, and daily commuters are facing immense hardship due to traffic congestion, damaged infrastructure, dust pollution, sewage overflow, accessibility issues, and unsafe conditions.

5. Lack of Stakeholder Engagement and Transparency

Despite being elected public representatives and direct stakeholders of the affected communities, we have not been formally taken on board regarding the project's planning, execution methodology, infrastructure design, drainage plans, sewerage replacement strategy, or traffic management arrangements.

We formally request that the complete design documents, technical drawings, infrastructure plans, and related construction details be shared with us for transparency and proper coordination with local representatives and communities.

In light of the seriousness of these issues, we strongly urge Green Climate Fund to arrange an urgent meeting with us through physical meeting, video conference, or audio call, or alternatively direct the concerned authorities and project management teams to immediately engage with us so that these matters can be resolved effectively through mutual coordination and consultation.

As elected representatives and stakeholders, we are fully willing to cooperate and provide constructive support in resolving several ground-level issues for the betterment of the public and successful execution of the project.

We look forward to your urgent response and immediate intervention in the larger public interest.
