

IRM Capacity Building and Outreach workshop - Kigali, Rwanda

Updated: 3 May 2023

Overview

As part of its mandate to provide redress and advance accountability at the Green Climate Fund, the Independent Redress Mechanism (IRM) is tasked with capacity building and outreach functions.

The IRM works with GCF Accredited Entities to help them build capacity related to grievance mechanisms and procedures. These grievance redress mechanisms (GRMs) work to address complaints at the project or programme level.

At the same time, the IRM seeks to share lessons about its experiences and increase awareness of its role and work among potential complainants and requesters, civil society (CSOs) and the public generally.

Capacity Building and Outreach Workshop

To build the capacity of the GRMs of GCF Accredited Entities and increase awareness of the IRM with civil society, the IRM will host a 4-day joint capacity building and outreach workshop in Africa.

A fifth day will be managed by the Independent Integrity Unit (IIU) and will focus on integrity issues. For CSOs interested in integrity issues, you can indicate your interest to participate in the Friday session.

The workshop is tentatively scheduled for 24-28 July 2023 and will be conducted in English.

Tentative location

- Kigali, Rwanda (first choice)
- Nairobi, Kenya (alternative choice)



Target audience

The IRM is looking to invite approximately 10 GRM participants and 10 CSO participants based in Africa. The IRM will cover the costs of participants coming from outside of the venue location.

- GRM participants should be working on issues around redress, audit, environmental and social standards, governance, etc.
- CSO participants should be working on issues around climate justice, environmental law, human rights, etc.

While multiple participants can come from the same country, participation is limited to one person per organisation.
